- Cook, C. & Sceles, S., At The Head of the Bay. . . A History of the People and Places of Boylston, Nova Scotia.
 - General History of people of the community of Boylston including appendices of all war veterans and all grave inscriptions in the village
- Guysborough Historical Society, Interred Within The Pioneers Of Guysborough.
 - Interred Within documents the history of those in Nova Scotia's oldest cemeteries; consecrated in 1787. Researched by various authors over a period of 4 years, it tells the stories of 47 pioneers of Guysborough, Nova Scotia
- Grant, L. Recollections of a Life In Guysborough. (3rd Edition)
 - New Edition of Laurier C. Grant's book was originally written as "... an attempt to put in writing a condensed genealogy of my parents' families as well as excerpts from my own experiences during my long life in Nova Scotia". This book provides an entertaining and informative perspective both relating to his family and significant times in the history of Guysborough. In this new edition there has been a new chapter added on the history of the Guysborough Hospital.
